Planning for the Future

GRU is looking to the future to identify the most cost-effective options for meeting Gainesville's evolving peak energy needs. Peak energy sources are needed when the demand for electricity is higher than the utility's regular baseload power supply can

support. This might occur on a hot summer afternoon, when customers are running their air conditioners, using electronic devices, and turning their lights on and off.

Some of the solutions GRU is considering include demand-side management programs and transmission system upgrades. As another option, GRU also is looking at generation sources and has secured a preliminary permit as a placeholder for a 50-megawatt natural gas power plant that can quickly generate more or less energy depending on customers' needs.

Evacuation and Sheltering for Special-needs Citizens

Alachua County's Special Needs Program provides emergency sheltering and evacuation assistance for citizens with certain medical conditions in the event of a hurricane or other natural disaster. Those with cognitive impairment or physical, mental or sensory disabilities must sign up with
