Your Utility Bill

GRU customers will see changes to their bills starting October 1, 2015, based on the fiscal year 2016 budget as preliminarily approved by the City Commission.

As part of the proposed budget, GRU recommended no electric rate increases. However, changes to the electric residential rate tier structure were approved which will mean some residential customers' bills will go up and some will go down.

Residential customers using electric, natural gas, water and wastewater services – about 30 percent of GRU customers – could see an increase of \$3.35 per month (based on industry standard usage comparisons as outlined in the chart below). This includes a \$0.95 increase for gas, \$2.80 increase for water and \$2 increase for wastewater.
